<p>1=strongly disagree, 2=disagree, 3=neither agree/disagree, 4=agree, 5= strongly agree.</p> <p>Over the course of the academic year, average teacher ratings for the following statements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 'I enjoy teaching PE' has risen from 3.3 to 4. 'I am a confident PE teacher' has risen from 2.3 to 3.7. 'I know what an Outstanding PE lesson should consist of' has risen from 2.7 to 4.3. 'My knowledge of Swimming (4.3), Dance (3.7), Gymnastics (4), Games (4), Athletics (4), Fundamental Movements (KS1 only) (4), OAA (4), using IT in PE lessons (3.3), warm-ups and cool-downs (3.7) has improved this year'. <p>The PE curriculum has been updated to respond to pupil demand.</p> <p>The amount of sports/activities covered in extra-curricular clubs increased from 6 to 11. Each extra-curricular sports club (2 per week) was attended by an average of 17 pupils (an increase from 13 the previous academic year).</p> <p>20 inter-school (level 2) sport competitions and 8 intra-school (level 1) sport competitions were attended. Memberships with HRS GP, ESFA and Rye Sports Cluster were maintained. The Silver Sainsbury's School Games Kitemark was once again achieved.</p> <p>The school now has 7 active school-club links with local sports clubs and coaches (an increase from 5).</p> <p>Over the 2015 summer holiday both a Sport England 'Primary Spaces' dedicated outside active area and a new hall that can be used for internal PE lessons and sports clubs are being installed. New gymnastic equipment has also been purchased in order to ensure that 'Outstanding' PE lessons can be delivered.</p>
